From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Happy and Blessed New Year! I hope and pray your 2024 begins on a good foot and a good note! As we enter this New Year, we enter the season of Epiphany, a season of light and making known the person and activity of Jesus, for those around us and for ourselves.

In John 1 and Mark 1, Jesus calls his disciples. These fisher folk are working in their daily tasks and then they leave their nets immediately. The immediacy compels the disciples in Mark's gospel to follow, to go where Jesus goes. Truth be told, they do not always figure out Jesus' mission initially. Even Nathanael, in the Gospel of John, has his questions and reservations, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:40, NRSV).

Philip responds, "Come and see" (John 1:46, NRSV).

In John's gospel, Jesus finds Philip and says, "Follow me". Philip follows. He does not only follow, but then invites and bear witness to who Jesus is "We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth." (John 1:44, NRSV). Following Jesus invites and challenges us to listen and respond, to wonder and ask questions. Since Jesus walks ahead of us, next to us and within us, this following takes on different forms. We might, at times feel lost, alone, afraid. These are all normal human responses and part and parcel of life. Jesus reveals that in the midst of the everyday feelings, challenges and troubles, God encounters and leads us on paths both familiar and new. Jesus meets us in the ordinary conversations of life and continues to say, "Follow me".

What helps reveal God's presence to you and through you? Where have you seen Christ at work in the last year? The last week?

How might God be inviting and equipping you to reflect the presence of Jesus in your world in this upcoming year?

We learn, remember and are reminded that the God we known in Jesus and the God that knows us desires for us to reflect Christ's love, Jesus compassion, and the Holy Spirit's boldness and courage. What a task and joy! Praise Christ that we walk this Way together.

And may your new year be blessed and filled with many new and wonderful opportunities!


