# From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ.

Where does Jesus show up in your life? Where have you seen God at work in and around you? A few weeks ago, the praise group at Prince of Peace, offered a song entitled, "There was Jesus", sung by Dolly Parton and Zach Williams. The song's chorus struck me as straightforward, yet amazing! The lyrics speak of meeting or encountering Jesus' presence, not just in the good and celebratory times of life, though that is true, but also in the challenging and difficult times in our lives, both individually and communally.

"In the waiting, in the searching
In the healing and the hurting
Like a blessing buried in the broken pieces
Every minute, every moment
Where I've been and where I'm going
Even when I didn't know it or couldn't see it
There was Jesus" (chorus, "There was Jesus", Source: Musixmatch, retrieved
YouTube, 9-25-2023).

Psalm 25, encourages us, as followers of Jesus, to continue noticing those places and spaces in our lives where God shows up! The psalmist writes,

"Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation" (Psalm 25:4-5, NRSV). For me, the most difficult places to notice God at work, are when things are not going the way I planned and in the midst of the ordinary and busyness of my day and week.

Yet the psalm and these lyrics might help us pause and notice when God arrives, "in the waiting, in the searching, in the healing and the hurting". Many times, we might not notice God's presence, at the time, yet looking back on the situation, we might be able to notice and appreciate Christ's presence as one who comes to comfort and guide us in challenging times and in the tasks of our daily lives.

What helps you to be more aware of God's presence in your daily life?

I'm encouraged by the apostle Paul's letter to the church in Philippi. In the last portion of the letter, a very normal situation occurs. An argument or disagreement, maybe even a conflict, between Euodia and Syntyche, two co-workers in sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ. We do not get a lot of details about what the disagreement might be about, but Paul encourages them to be of the same mind. I do not think this means to think exactly alike, but to work together and work it out as much as humanly possible for the greater good of the community. What a challenging task, yet even in discussion and conflict, Jesus promises to show up! The apostle Paul offers these words to the church in Philippi, but also to us:

"Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, what ever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you" (Philippians 4:8-9, NRSV). God's Holy Spirit continue to help us notice the ways that Christ shows up within and around us.


