From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

"5Your love, O Lord, reaches to the heavens, and your faithfulness to the clouds...

⁹For with you is the well of life, and in your light we see light." (Psalm 35:5 and 9, NRSV).

Welcome to February! If it feels like Groundhog's Day all over again for you, you are not alone. The weather report, as I write this, is for continued clouds and fog, wash, repeat. The fog, as a weather phenomenon, is a neat idea, but it does not bring in much light, just a gray and soupy look to the landscape. I recall about three weeks ago that there was a gloriously bright sun shiny day and I was in awe! The clouds parted, the blue hue of the sky reflected and the clouds felt like marshmallows ready to be roasted over a camp fire. I tried to store that sunshine image in my mind, in my mood, in my movements, but after a day or two it seemed a distant memory. Even though I do not particularly enjoy multiple days of fog and clouds at a time, I do appreciate the contrast in weather events, the change in seasons as a way to mark time, both on the calendar and in my life. I am not a fan of the seemingly constant clouds and fog in this part of Winter, but I'm trying to making the best of it.

As we begin February, I go back to these verses from Psalm 36 because it gives me a different perspective. In the midst of the cloudy foggy days, I notice that God's love reaches to the heavens and the Lord's faithfulness reaches to the clouds. Part of the challenge of the cloudy and foggy weather and when things get cloudy and foggy in my life is that I do not necessarily see the way forward. I don't see a clear path, the illuminated roadway, with its signposts and streetlights. Those road markers, if you will, are enveloped, or at least dampened by this weather pattern. I'm preaching to the choir here.....The truth is life has been very hard, difficult and challenging not only in the last month, but last couple of years and just when it seems that we have clear skies and smooth sailing, the clouds and fog blow in.

We can share those difficult and taxing times with one another. God wants us to share our burdens and times we feel overwhelmed because if God's love reaches to the heavens, it also reaches in and through the cloudy foggy times of life. "In your light, we see light" (Psalm 35:9).

As we continue walking through Epiphany, Jesus directs our eyes and our actions to notice and respond to the revealing of Jesus' life and light giving activity in the midst of a weary and fog filled world. The light of the sun will shine again! It will break through the clouds and soupy grayness and reveal the life in the midst of the fog. The road and path that we have continued to travel as leaders and servants of the Lord. Even now, the light of Christ is entering our lives, revealing that even when we are uncertain of the next step, Christ Jesus is guiding us. Christ Jesus is placing people and trail signs, sign posts and traffic lights alongside your path, to help us and support us. Jesus, in the Gospel reading from Luke chapter 5, in February, will invite weary and tired fisher folk to keep on tossing their nets out into the mist and fog. He does this, in part, because Christ remains with us, walking, working, and waiting with us in the fog, revealing God's light to light our way.

Where do you see Christ's light in the midst of the fog and clouds? How might you share the glow of Christ's presence in these foggy times? How is Christ inviting you to pause, to rest, to renew in the midst of the fog and clouds? Where do you see the glimpses of God's loving light in your world?


From The President


