From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ.

Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! We enter into the season of Easter, the time we embody the resurrection of Jesus! Mark's gospel, at least the most reliable ending, which concludes with verse 8, leaves the first disciples in fear and trembling. They do not respond with shouts of joy, instead "for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid" (Mark 16:8, NRSV). The reality of Jesus' resurrection leaves the first disciples in awe and fear, trembling and tight lipped about this life changing event. It reveals the reality of our human attempts to understand and fully comprehend what this Easter season reveals about a God in Christ who continues to upend our expectations. And yet, Jesus shows up, Jesus meets up with us, going ahead of us to the places and spaces where Christ's life-giving presence and power sustains, empowers, and supports us in our lives and for the sake of the world.

As we look around our world, we are invited, in the midst of our awe and fear, our worry and confusion, to notice to God's continued surprising and sustaining presence and power within and among us and in our world. I really like the ending to the Gospel of Mark because in the unresolved ending, we might pause and consider our own response to this good news. Where is the living Christ going ahead of us, walking beside us? We are invited to notice that this is not the end of the story, even in Mark's gospel.

John's gospel in chapter 20, puts more of a point on this type of ending, "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:30-31, NRSV). Yet even in John's gospel, the story continues with chapter 21!

Jesus' lack of appearance in Mark's gospel, eventually leads the disciples to share the story, to begin and continue wrapping their minds around this astounding mystery and promise that now arrives in our midst, in our daily lives, in the workday, with our families, friends, and in our community, God continues to show up! It does not usually happen on our time schedule, so we are invited and challenged to cling to the words of God's messenger, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciple and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you" (Mark 16:6-8, NRSV). Jesus, The Crucified One, has been raised! I appreciate that the first disciples respond with very human emotions, considering the events that had just witnessed. The resurrection of Our Lord both confounds and comforts us, as we continually make sense and walk by faith, bearing witness to this Christ that leads, guides, and surprises us in our life.

As we continue through April, we'll hear and see the Christian community in the Book of Acts during this Easter season. The presence and power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus' presence with the gathered and sent followers of God, continuing to bear witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus within and among us, within and among the world. Where do you notice Christ's presence in your life? What does it look like? Sound like? How might we see the realities of our modern world and the life of the church with honesty, kindness, and truthfulness, while clinging to the promise that Jesus walks beside and ahead of us! Where might we see God's life-giving presence in our everyday lives, in surprising places?

Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! God bless you as the Holy Spirit goes with us and ahead of us, as we share the story of God's love in, with and for our community!


Worship the Lord with gratitude by writing your own prayer of thanksgiving.

Spring is on the way.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Executive Council and the Finance Committee have been looking at various accounts where money was set aside but not accessed. Two accounts we researched are Concession Revenue (\$599.40) and Uganda Mission Trip Funds (\$1,488.92). We talked to the congregation members who coordinated both those efforts and suggested an offering of \$1000 be made to World Water Day via Hope for Kids International. The Council approved the request. Hope for Kids International obtained triple matching funds so the \$1000 became \$3000! The remaining funds (\$1,088.32) are being allocated toward future projects.

Contact has been made with Mission Investment to ask about money was allocated for the building. In addition, we are asking for a disbursement from the Endowment account held at MIF to fund scholarships for six (6) campers to Lutherhaven.

We have benevolences to be paid for 4th Quarter 2023 and will soon be needing to pay 1st Quarter of 2024. I looked at income last year to see how our giving compares. Remember, last year we had a mortgage to pay and we alleviated the pressure of that large payment in August 2023. I am confident we will make up this shortfall! Since this is being written prior to final giving totals for March, our 2024 March total is not provided.
