From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Where have you seen God's love poured out? In you? Through you? The book of Romans reveals the apostle Paul's proclamation of God's activity for us, for you! Rest in the promise, restore, renew, and live in the freedom of Christ's outrageous gift of life! "Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand" (Romans 5:1-2, NRSV). Since, not if, then, but SINCE, we are justified by faith, the active bold, dogged activity of God's Holy Spirit making us right with God, the Holy Spirit aligning our hearts, minds, and deeds with Christ, we have access to God's grace, Christ's life giving presence. I wonder, "There must be strings attached, anything too good to be true probably is", yet the perspective that the apostle Paul opens for us envisions God coming to us, as the main actor, the One doing the heavy lifting, tearing down the dividing wall, removing the obstacles to reveal this amazing gift.

Yet, we live our lives and the world around and inside us speaks a different story. Just because you follow Jesus does not mean you're on the road to easy street.

I am trying to "landscape" my front yard, but the lawn is infested with moss and it's taking me a loooong time to remove even small pieces of sod. The vision of the beauty and utility of even a section of my yard has run into a number of hiccups. The letter to the church at Rome offers the gift and promise of God's gracious intrusion, but also acknowledges that on this side of heaven we will experience troubles, failures, disappointments, road blocks and just plain old cruddy stuff in our lives.

Yet God continues to pursue us, granting us this peace in the midst of the struggles. The peace of God is the presence of God, God's willingness to help us work towards restoration and renewing our lives and relationships as images of Christ's love, forgiveness, belonging, and strength.

The apostle Paul continues with the "boasting" in our sufferings. Already Paul has excluded boasting or a humble brag, yet here, boasting points toward God's activity and revolves around God's work in and through us.

Where have you seen God working amid the struggles of your life?

In this first section of Romans 5, Paul proclaims, "hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Romans 5:5, NRSV).

My daughters had a couple of water balloon fights and the puddles of water, the wet foot prints walking through the house reminds me of a measure of God's love being poured into us. This love that covers and fills us, so completely it overflows and we leave foot marks, life marks of Christ's life and presence flowing from us. God bless you as you enjoy and relish the days of June! How might you share the gift of Christ's love this month?



The story was very simple and straightforward, which for me always seems quite surprising. (I just don't understand why it's so hard for me to figure out!) The story was about a woman living in a senior community who hurried down from her apartment to the manager's office. She had a sudden spray of water coming from under her bathroom sink! After listening to the details of her story; the manager ran up to the second floor and right to her neighbor's apartment. The perplexed woman protested and said he was at the wrong apartment. He said he knew, but continued in anyway. While the manager knew nothing about plumbing, he did know that he had a plumber working in the neighboring apartment. The manager suspected the problems were related, but more importantly, he knew he could produce a plumber to deal with the woman's situation.

It's easy to empathize with the woman's confusion. So often we do not see or even know the big picture. When we give our problems over to God, we may wonder, "How will God help? Why is this happening instead of that?" We often have our own ideas about how to solve a problem, but God sees the big picture - God knows the whole picture. It's up to us to trust God knowing His ways are better than ours and that He will guide us through.
