From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

We will soon enter June and the summer months. A time of planting, watering, nurturing, and weeding flowers, plants, trees, bushes, even shrubs. Jesus compares the kingdom of God, not to a beautiful rhododendron, maple, or even a flowering tree, but to a mustard seed.

Imagine planting mustard in your yard?

"With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? ³¹It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; ³²yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

Jesus points out the smallness of the seed, yet it "becomes the greatest of all shrubs". What a strange picture for the activity of God, for the presence of Jesus at work in the world! I would much prefer the beauty and splendor or Manito Park, even a well-manicured yard, but a giant mustard shrub seems a little ridiculous, a lot ridiculous!

Yet this shrub's branches grow, "so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade" (Mark 4:32, NRSV). A place and space for birds of the air to find shade, a place out of the searing heat, a place of rest and renewal, so that they may go on and do their "birds of the air" things. Feeding, tending, conversing to help sustain and help the bird folks flourish.

What might you compare the kingdom of God to? What picture, illustration, or story helps illustrate what God's work in the world, the kingdom of God look like?

What needs watered and nurtured in your relationship with God? Where do you see Christ at work in the midst of creation? I recently drove through the Palouse, on my way to Pullman. The fields of wheat, barley, chickpeas are in full green! Yet the patient persistence continues.

God in Christ continues to give us what we need, even when it might look like a "glorious" mustard shrub! Providing us with shade, with rest, with sustenance, so that in the midst of our lives we can notice Christ's work and presence moving and flowing through us.

I pray that God grants you time of refreshment and enjoy, as the flowers bloom, the gardens grow and the birds nest, so that we can participate in the work of God happening within and among us!

29 years ago....

On September 10, 1995 the congregations of Ascension Lutheran and Calvary Lutheran officially joined as one congregation called Prince of Peace Lutheran. Each congregation brought their own unique history and way of doing things and consolidated into one congregation. During the time of transition Rev. John Vaswig and Rev. Michael Sager pastors of Calvary were called to serve the new congregation of Prince of Peace Lutheran. Rev. Don Schneuker who was serving as interim pastor at Ascension joined the new congregation to continue his retirement. In 1995 the congregation had a median age of 34 and was looking forward to a bright future in the new community of Indian Trail.

NO.



Thank you for your financial support of Prince of Peace. I am happy to share that we are paying our 1st Quarter Benevolences for 2024! There was some additional income in March and April that helped us within some other areas of our budget.

In looking at our giving for May, we have experienced a shortfall in the amount needed to cover the approved budget. Maybe it's a May thing, but we had a shortfall in 2023 of \$6,575.04 with a very large mortgage payment to cover!
