From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

What helps your soul, yourself, find refreshment and renewal? The prophet Isaiah shares God's message of invitation to water that quenches our thirst, "Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters" (Isaiah 55:1, NRSV). Isaiah proclaims this message, as God's people are in the midst of disorientation, having a terrible, horrible, no good very bad day or week or year.

This invitation from God opens up the possibility and promise that our thirsty and parched places in our life are met with the river and stream of God's ever flowing life. This water is for everyone. Amidst the hot days and hot nights, we are encouraged to limit our water consumption, be water wise, as we steward the natural resources that we tend to in our daily activities. Water is life and in it, we receive life, to give us energy, fuel, coolness, that allows us to move, work, grow, and be.

This invitation from Isaiah offers wine and milk from God's banquet table as a gift! This seems preposterous, there must be strings attached! Yet Isaiah shares these promises that God's people, that you and I are invited into relationship with God in Christ to experience life, renewal, and the food of God that does not perish.

Matthew shares the story of the feeding of the five thousand. Jesus seeks out a place of quiet and solitude, yet people track him down. Jesus had just experienced the devastating news that John the Baptist had been killed. "Now, when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself" (Matthew 14:13). We are not meant to run 24/7/365 without a break, especially when heartache or heartbreak enters our life. This is one of many examples that even the Son of God needed some rest, solitude, and a quiet place to reconnect.

I wonder how long it took the crowds to find out where Jesus was? I wonder how long Jesus stayed out on the boat in the lake before returning to shore? In the story itself, it seems that it might have been only minutes, yet I wonder. The crowds did hear and followed Jesus to the town.

In some ways, Jesus reflects the passage from Isaiah in his response to the crowds. His disciples are dubious, doubting whether this "deserted place" would have any food or drink available. It's human nature to doubt and question in our lives of faith, to ask questions, like the disciples asked Jesus. Yet God provides in ways that might surprise us.

"Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, that you may live" (Isaiah 55:2-3, NRSV). Listen carefully, what a challenge! God invites God's people to ponder and practice this listening and doing posture that leads to life. Our life shaped by Christ's life, living, moving, and active within and among us. May Christ grant you rest, renewal, and be filled with the goodness of God, who offers the food and water of life, love, and strength to us and to all people.






