Financial Update

The chart below shows an offering comparison from 2023, 2024, and 2025. This same chart is also posted in our Sanctuary, near the Kitchen. The grey line shows our giving for 2025 and at this writing, offering for July was not tallied. What you may notice is we are in an offering decline. The exception is December 2024 when our giving spiked at \$64k. Some of that money was used to pay 2024 Benevolences for Quarters 3 and 4, transferred to our savings, and remained in our operating account. There was also money designated for replacement of our Sanctuary lighting that was placed in our Building Fund. Through May of 2025, we paid our Qtr 1 Benevolences along with paying our expenses (bills, payroll, etc.) The extra in our operating account from December 2024 helped, but those funds have dwindled and we have needed to withdraw from the savings account twice (June and July) to meet our payroll obligations and to pay Quarter 2 Benevolences.

Another chart showing our Approved 2025 Budget will be posted near this one in the Sanctuary. It includes allocated dollar amounts and percentages you might find interesting.

After our January 2026 Annual Meeting, I will not be continuing in the role of treasurer for Prince of Peace. We are looking for a Financial Secretary and Treasurer along with several other Council positions. I hope you will feel called.


