From Pastor Joel Skindlov

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

A blessed Advent, as we enter this month of December! The church season, Advent, offers words of comfort and challenge. The church season gives us opportunity to pause and reflect on Christ's coming, as a child, born in a stable and Christ's return, when Christ returns to judge the world in righteousness. The tension resides in the variety of the already, but not yet world that God envisions for us and through us. Advent means "to come" and the weeks leading up to Christmas can serve as a time to prepare, watch, wait, and participate in God's work and presence in our lives and world now and in the future.

I'm struck by the hymn "What Child is This?" every year, but particularly in the longing and promise of Jesus' birth and life as we near the end of 2025. As I look out the window, the sun is out, yet the chilly wind brings a sense of the weather and season to come as we enter the last month of the year. It is a sense of the sun's warmth and also the colder weather and heading toward shorter daylight hours. This here, but not yet serves as a constant reality in our lives, whether it's watchful waiting, a sense of the drudgery of waiting, the weight of waiting, and yet also the expectancy of waiting and the new life and possibilities that continue to be revealed as Christ enters our lives and remains with us each and every day.

"What Child is this who laid to rest on Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet, while shepherds watch are keeping?" (LBW, Lutheran Book of Worship, # 40 or you can look it up on the internet).

Christ the King Sunday concludes the church season of Pentecost. We move from the image of Jesus as a King, a royal ruler, seated upon a throne, high and lifted up, the powerful, filled with strength and might and yet not living as a usual or typical power broker or member of a royal family.

We expect this all-powerful Christ to thwart evil and sin by destroying them, which Jesus does, yet many times, Jesus puts his power into practice by healing, redeeming and setting people free from their bondage and captivity from sin and death. The watching, waiting and preparing allows followers of Christ to participate in God's work that happens in our lives and world as a promise to grant us the (continued on page 8)



- Oversee the direct deposit that members can use to make their donations. The Financial Secretary has access to Vanco, our On-line ACH Processor, to input the information as requested.
- Orders and distributes to church members their offering envelopes.

courage, compassion and power to embody and imagine a world and way that looks to care, share and serve as the hands and feet of Jesus in our world, in our community, our neighborhoods, and households.

In Jesus' birth, we receive God in the flesh as a tiny, helpless, vulnerable little baby, laid in a manger and dependent on his parents for food and nurture. The amazing surprise that God comes to dwell with us and take on flesh and blood, to be a human person instead of a superhero, who understands and walks with us in the beauty and messiness of humanity, not as a favor to us from some far away God, but from the God we know in Jesus who enters the world as fully God and fully man. Christ's birth marks God's willingness to enter into humanity's particularities and predicaments, even as we attempt to comprehend the depths of our joys and pains, our struggles and our celebrations.

We have the opportunity to wonder and embody the gift of the Christ child, the gift of God's sustaining presence and power that allows us to loosen our grasp slightly on our control and rest and be renewed in God in Christ's already but not yet presence in our here and now.

How might God tend and strengthen your relationship this Advent? How might God's faithfulness throughout the generations be a comfort and opportunity to see ourselves and those around us as beloved people of God?
